Reemo & Juniper

We are collaborating with UCare and another of their MSHO supplemental benefit providers, [Reemo](#), to test a new engagement method – push notifications from Reemo smart watches!

UCare MSHO members who have Reemo watches will get a notification inviting them to learn more about Juniper falls prevention classes as part of Fall Prevention Awareness month. Members will respond on their watches and then UCare will provide a file to Juniper with all the "yes" responses for us to make outbound calls!

These notifications went out Monday (9/30) to around 1,800 UCare MSHO members, though UCare reports that only about half of those who have a Reemo watch use it regularly. Still, 900 is a lot of reach!

As of October 14th, 37 UCare Reemo users responded “yes” to receive outreach about Juniper fall prevention programs. We are waiting for contact information for these 37 individuals. Once we receive their contact information, we will make outreach calls to engage and enroll them into fall prevention classes.

Q4 HealthPartners MSHO Outreach

As we shared at the September 2025 application Q&A meeting, HealthPartners has decided not to continue our contract for the wellness engagement center (WEC) in 2025. This means we will not receive eligibility lists from HealthPartners to conduct outreach calls to HealthPartners MSHO members to engage and enroll them into classes.

WEC has enrolled 98 MSHO members into classes so far in 2024. Q4 2024 is our final quarter to conduct outreach calls using the eligibility lists from HealthPartners. Please schedule your Q1 2025 classes on yourjuniper.org before October 21st to have your classes listed as an option for these MSHO members as we conduct outreach calls.

HealthPartners MSHO members will continue to have Juniper as a free member benefit in 2025.

Return on investments in social determinants of health interventions

A literature review of research done on social determinants of health (SDOH) interventions and their outcomes. A methodology was applied to the outcomes to estimate return on investment. SDOH interventions reviewed included interventions for food insecurity (average ROI 85%) and housing insecurity (average ROI 50%). Research like this helps community care hubs like ours articulate the value of social care services for the health and wellbeing of Minnesotans. We expect to see more studies like this as healthcare continues to look to address SDOH gaps!
